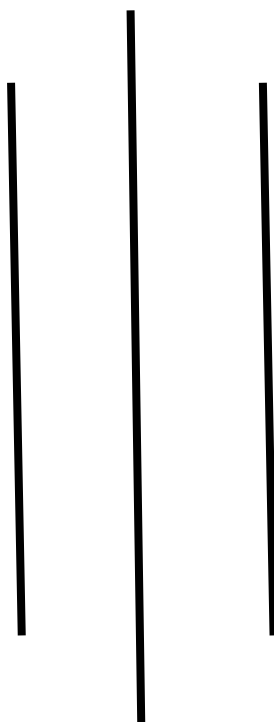

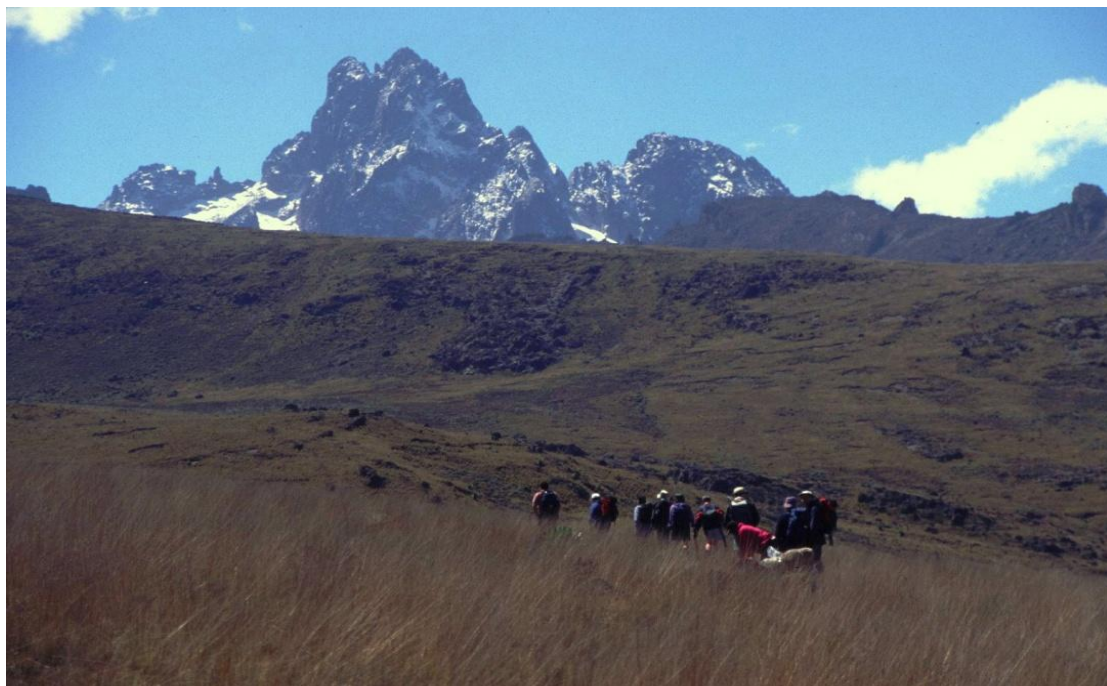

PART II

TOURIST ARRIVALS



Nepal Tourism Policy 2009 identifies tourism sector as an important vehicle for economic and social development. Following directions set by the policy effort has been put for development and expansion of tourism activities, quality improvement of tourism services, increasing revenue and expansion of employment opportunities to improve the living standard of Nepalese people. Vision 2020 of tourism envisions increasing tourist arrival to two million and tourism related employment to one million.

Trend of tourist arrival was in increased order up to 2012 which declined thereafter. Year 2015 seems most shocking having decrease by 32 percent compared to 2014.

Out of total tourist arrivals, excluding Indian citizens arrived through land transportations, five countries occupy 48 percent. The proportion of tourists from these countries are; India (14%), China (12%), USA (10%), Sri Lanka (8%) and Thailand (6%). Higher number of arrival is observed in March following general trend but sharply declined in May contradicting to the past. By sex male (54%) and by age category 31-45 (29%) are following past trend of higher share.

FIGURE 2.1: TOURIST ARRIVAL AND AVERAGE LENGTH OF STAY ON CHART (2000-2015)

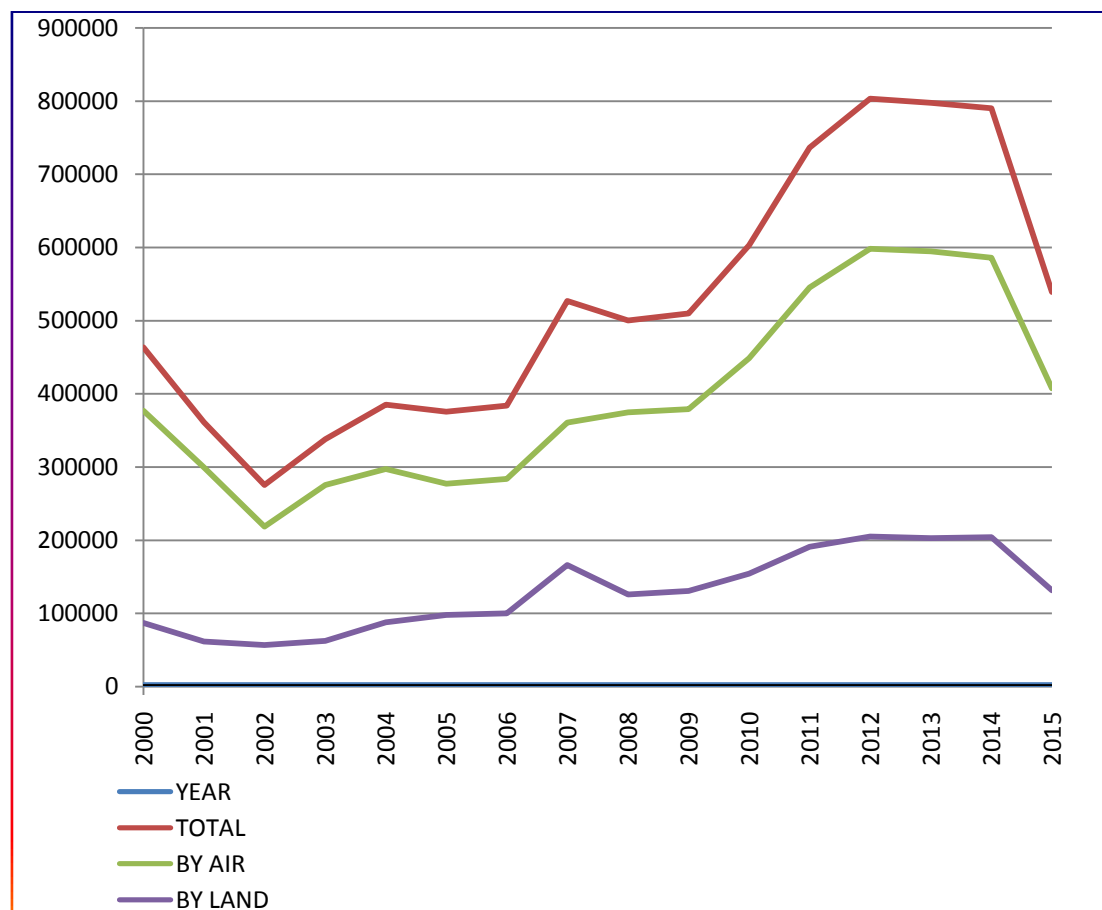

FIGURE 2.2: TOURIST ARRIVAL BY MONTH, 2011-2015

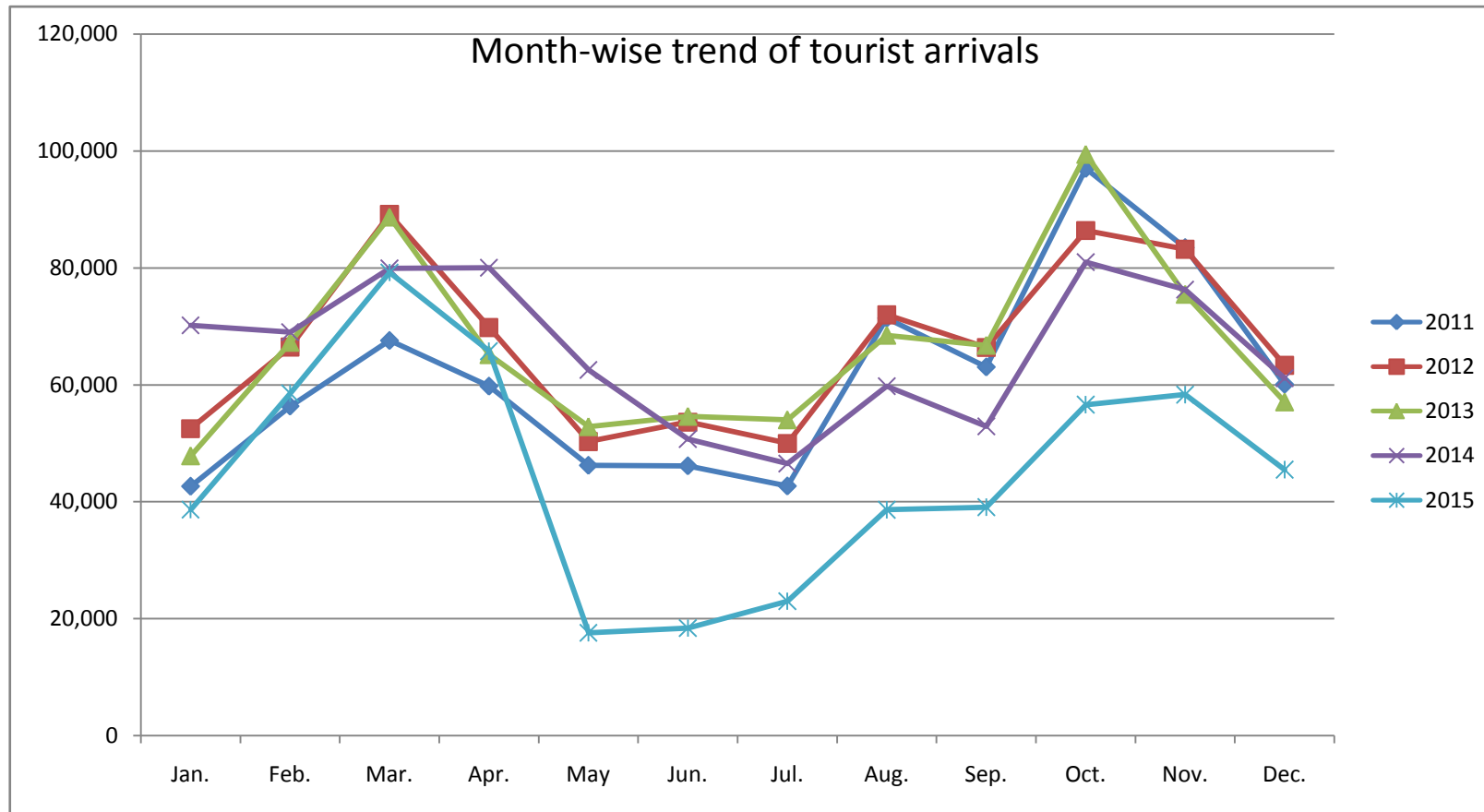

FIGURE 2.4: TOURIST ARRIVAL BY SEX, 2000-2015

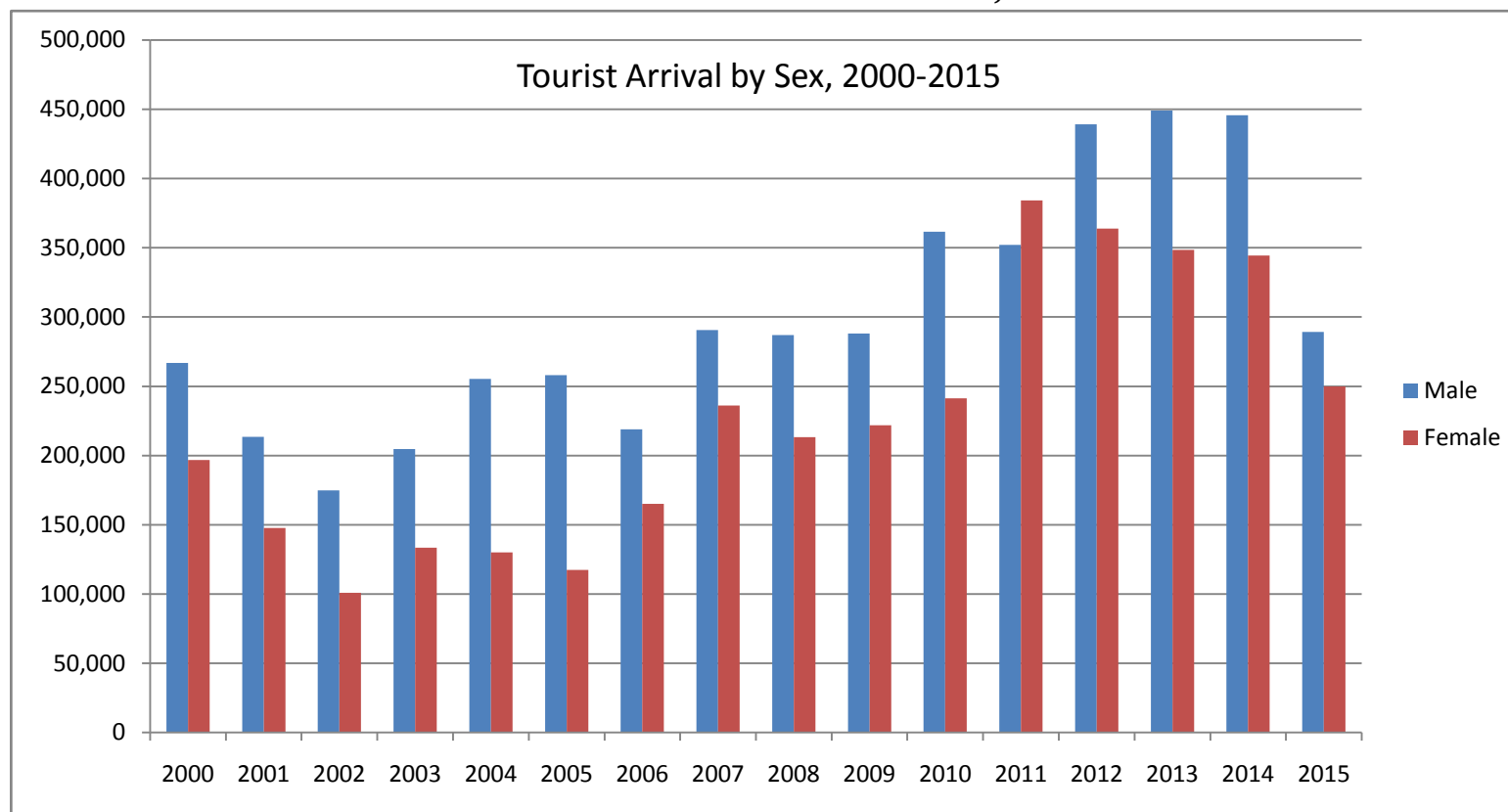

FIGURE 2.5: TOURIST ARRIVAL BY AGE CATEGORY, 2011-2015

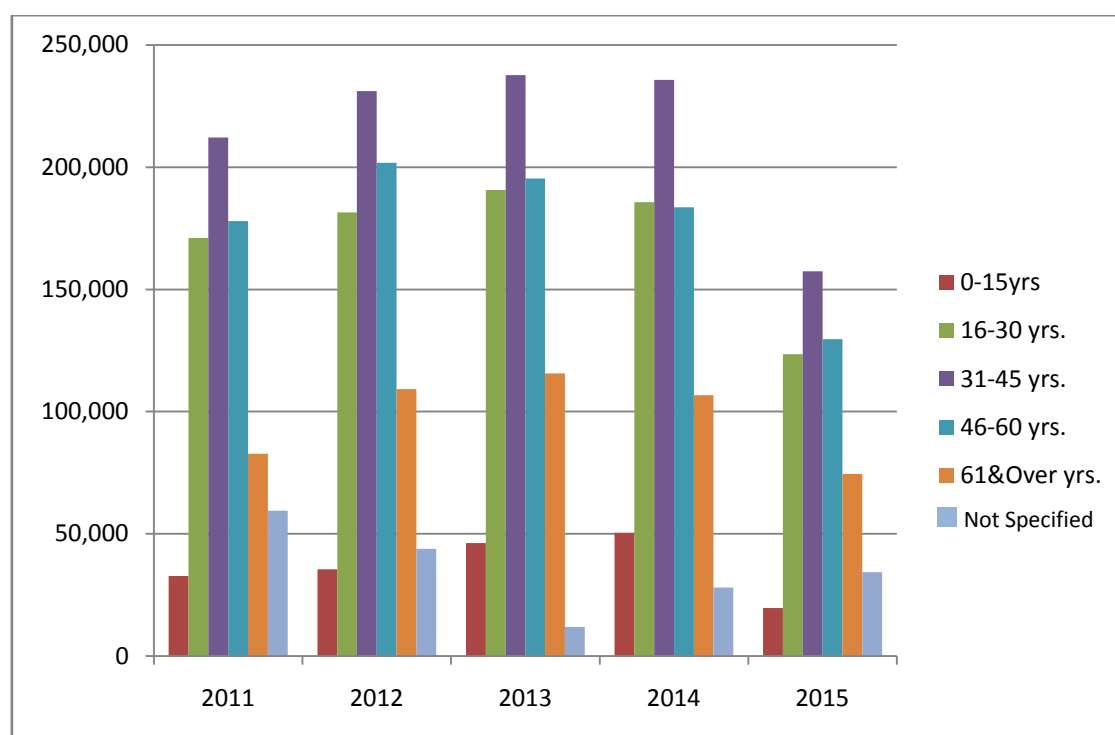

LENGTH OF STAY



Length of stay increase points towards improvement in tourism industry that boosts revenue generation. Three year development plan aimed to increase the length of stay to 14 days by 2015. It was ranging from 8 to 13.5 days in the past. The analysis of length of stay of 290000 tourists estimated it as 13.16 days in the year 2015. Among the higher tourist sharing five countries USA (16.98) is leading the stay followed by China (10.14). Young people of age (10-24) seems staying long (16.73) after child (less than 10 years). There is no significant difference by sex. The visitors arrived in the month of October are observed as long staying (17.55)

PART-IV

PURPOSE OF VISIT



Number of tourist by purpose of visit is a major indicator for tourism sector output. This indicator is very useful for evaluation of characteristics, type and economic and social contributions made by tourists and to plan and manage infrastructure, services and market economy accordingly. It also shows inflow of high value tourists. Historical data shows around half of the tourist arrived with purpose of holiday celebration and pleasure. Though, few number of years have shown this group reduced. Year 2015 shows higher proportion (72%) visited nepal for holiday and pleasure followed by trade (4%), official purpose (4%), pilgrimage (3%) and conference/meeting (1.7%). Pilgrimage and trekking/mountaineering showed high declines.

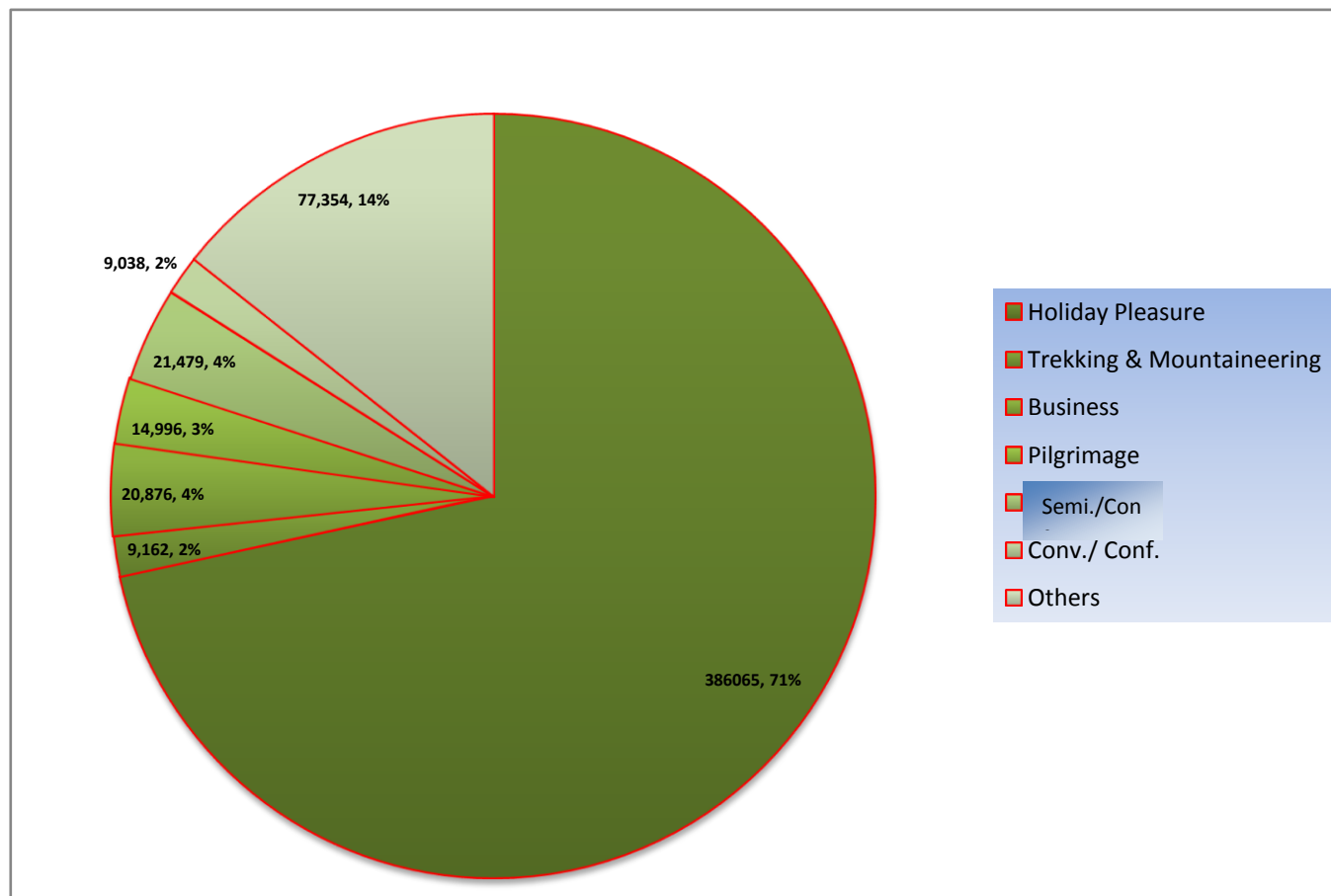

PART-V

TREKKING & EXPEDITION



Nepalese mountaineering is renowned for adventure tourism due to its prominent peaks. Government has taken the policy to make it special destinations by managing mountaineering sector in environment friendly manner. Trend shows increasing mountaineers and revenue generation.

The number of expedition permitted teams has reached to 380 while 4003 in persons. Out of them 825 succeeded summit to various peaks composed by 628 foreign and 197 Nepalese.

The amount of royalty received has reduced in 2015 compared to 2014. The main reason observed behind is less number of visitors to high royalty peaks than others. Mount Everest contributes 73 percent of the total royalty received. Germany is the leading source country in 2015 followed by USA in terms of permit issue.

It was visited by 748294 persons out of them 66% were Nepalese while 17% Indians and 17% from other countries occupied the share. February was the most preferred month for Lumbini visit.

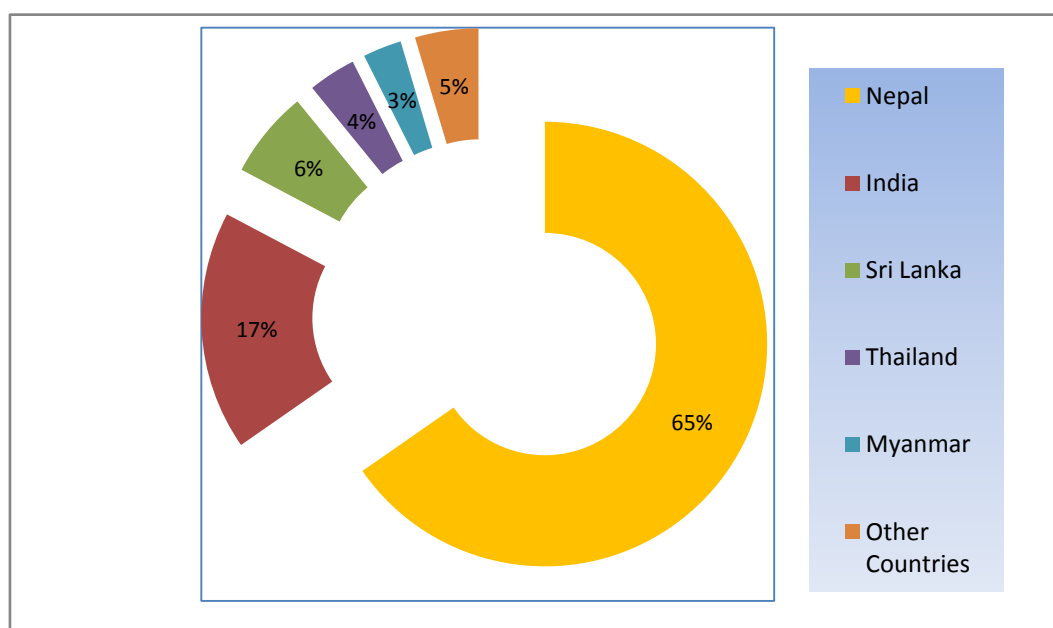

PART-VII

REVENUE GENERATION



Revenue from tourism sector is observed from foreign currency exchange made by tourists and tourism industries as proxy of income. All domestic contribution is not captured. Historical data is presented by Nepali fiscal year thus monthly adjustment is made for year 2015.

Nepal Rastra Bank report shows total foreign currency exchange (less return) for 2015 stood at Nrs. 49,783,840,000 (Arround 488,030 thousand US\$). This is slightly higher than previous year 2014 estimated by month breakdown. This increase in currency income despite fall in tourist arrival brings per tourist per day expenditure at 68.57 USD. Per tourist expenditure in the months of May, June and July seems much higher than average expenditure. Around 80 percent of exchange is made by tourists themselves.

FIGURE 7.1: GROSS FOREIGN EXCHANGE EARNINGS FROM TOURISM

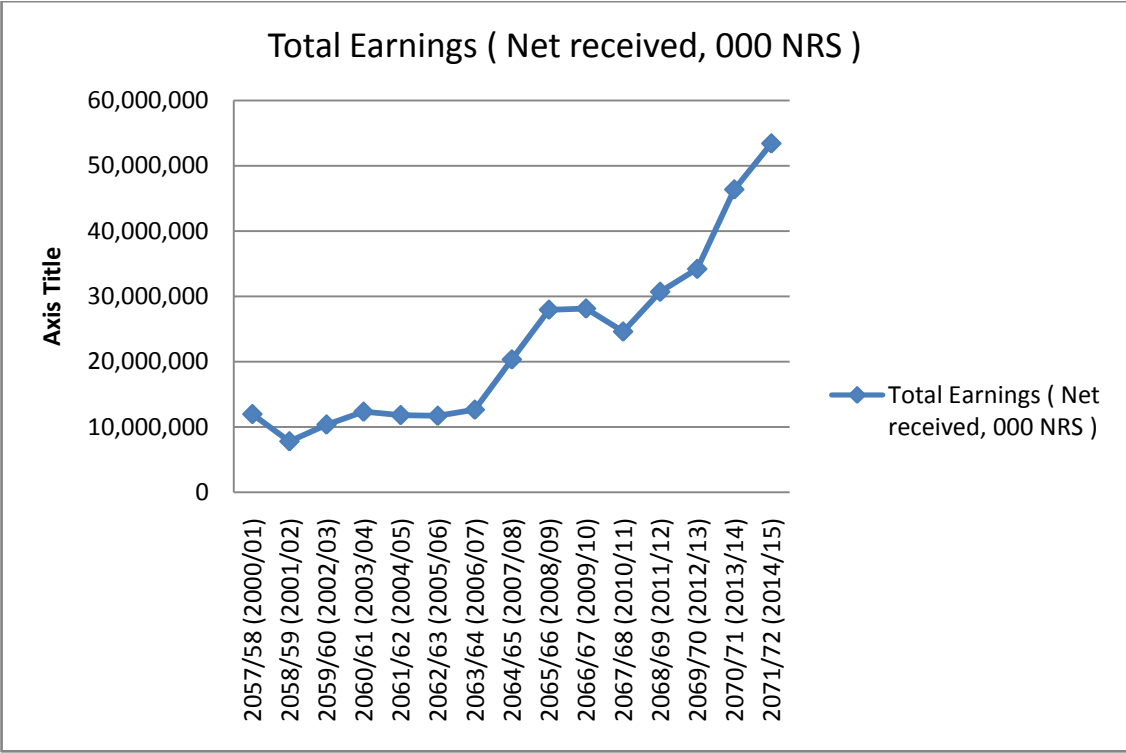

To meet the target of tourist arrival, number of flights has to be increased remarkably due to its weak road connectivity to the rest of the world. Similarly international and domestic airports and other infrastructure have to be upgraded. GoN has identified these issues and keeping effort for development in civil aviation sector.

Out of 56 airports in Nepal 32 airports are in operations. Twenty two airports run in all seasons. Six airports are under construction and 18 are as non-function.

Twenty six international airlines carried 3217162 tourists out of which 1674664 were outbound and 1542498 in-bound and carried 23688.5 tons of cargo in and out through 26564 numbers of flights. The number of countries having civil aviation contract reached to 38. There are 17 airlines for domestic movement.

TOURISM INDUSTRY



Tourism sector of Nepal is managed with partnership of Government, private sector, households, professionals and NGOs. Tourism industries play pivotal roles in tourist service, service management, increasing revenue and increasing length of stay.

There are beds provided by all hotels registered in Nepal including 116 star levels. Three casino and three mini casinos are in operation that provided 234 million NRs revenue in 2015 including collected backlogs. Travel agency, tour guide, tour operators, rafting agencies, trekking agencies and guides all are in increasing number of trend. All the human resources are trained in either NATHM or other institutions.

It has produced 168 persons with Master of Hospitality Management, 1376 in Bachelor of Hotel Management (BHM) and 861 Bachelor of Travel and Tourism Management (BTTM) 2015. Total 58140 persons have received basic, mid-level and supervisor level trainings. Total trained manpower in the tourism sector has reached to 60545 up to year 2015. Information from non-government sector is not received in the report.
